3 Reason for removing carbon accounting areas

6 Payment

There is a fee for submitting this application if the land you are applying to remove is registered in standard forestry. There is currently no fee for applying to remove land from permanent forestry. However, land can only be removed from permanent forestry with approval from the Minister for Climate Change.

The fee for applying to remove part of one or more carbon accounting areas from standard forestry is \$495.00 (excluding GST). You will be required to pay this amount when you submit your application in Tupu-ake – Forestry ETS online services.

Your application will not be processed until this fee is paid.

7 Option to deregister

Complete this section if you are removing all the post-1989 forest land you have in the ETS, or all the land for which you're registered as one or more of the following:

- a landowner with post-1989 forest land in standard forestry
- a landowner with post-1989 forest land in permanent forestry
- a forestry right or lease holder with post-1989 forest land in standard forestry
- a forestry right or lease holder with post-1989 forest land in permanent forestry
- a party to a Crown conservation contract with post-1989 forest land in standard forestry
- a party to a Crown conservation contract with post-1989 forest land in permanent forestry.

How to submit your application

If you are applying to remove a carbon accounting area registered as standard forestry:

1. Log-in to Tupu-ake – Forestry ETS online services, available at www.mpi.govt.nz/ets-online-system/
2. Select the service **Post-1989 forest land (standard) > Add, update or reconfigure forest land > Apply to remove whole carbon accounting areas.**
3. Upload the completed form to the file upload on the main summary page.

If you are applying to remove a carbon accounting area registered as permanent forestry:

1. Log-in to Tupu-ake – Forestry ETS online services, available at www.mpi.govt.nz/ets-online-system/
2. Select the service **Post-1989 forest land (permanent) > Add, update or reconfigure forest land > Apply to remove whole carbon accounting areas.**
3. Upload the completed form to the file upload on the main summary page.

Next steps

When you remove land from the ETS, you must pay (surrender) the unit balance of the land to the Environmental Protection Authority (EPA). The EPA will contact you with instructions and how many units you must pay.

However, you may not need to pay units if you remove land because:

- a natural event has happened that permanently prevents the re-establishment of the forest (for example, a river has eroded the land), or
- the land has been cleared for Best Practice Forest Management (for example, to comply with National Environmental Standards for Plantation Forestry).

If you have selected either of these reasons, we will complete checks to verify it.
