

Tell us you are deforesting pre-1990 forest land

Forestry in the Emissions Trading Scheme - pre-1990

Use this form to tell us if you deforest more than two hectares of pre-1990 forest land in any mandatory emissions return period.

Deforestation has a specific definition in the ETS. Forest land is considered deforested when it is cleared and:

- the land is used for something else (such as pasture), or
- the forest land doesn't meet certain stocking and growth thresholds four, 10 and 20 years after clearing.

When to submit this form

You must submit this notification within 20 working days of deforestation.

If the forest was cleared and converted to another land use, the date of deforestation is the date on which conversion begins.

When forest land is deforested by not being replanted or regenerated to the required stocking and growth thresholds, the date of deforestation is the date it fails to meet these thresholds, i.e. 4, 10 or 20 years after clearing.

Information from this application may be shared with the inventory agency or the registrar of the NZETR to carry out their functions under the Climate Change Response Act 2002.

You must complete every field in this form, except the ones labelled 'optional'.

1) Landowner/Third party

In most cases when pre-1990 land is deforested, the landowner is responsible for notifying us and submitting an emissions return. This is true unless Te Uru Rākau – New Zealand Forest Service is satisfied that:

- the landowner formally agreed to give the right to decide to deforest to someone else
- the landowner had no control over the decision to deforest.

In this situation, the person responsible for the decision to deforest must notify us and file the return.

3) New Zealand Emissions Trading Register (NZETR) holding account

- 2. Select the service **Pre-1990 forest land > Manage deforestation > Tell us about deforestation**.
- 3. Upload the completed form to the file upload on the main summary page.

Next steps

You must submit an emissions return before 31 March in the year after you deforest pre-1990 forest land. Any New Zealand Units that you owe for this emissions return must be paid (surrendered) by 31 May of the same year.
