BOVSEM.TZ 20 December 2017 – Bovine Semen to The United Republic of Tanzania

1. Statutory authority

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

- (i) the issue under section 60 of the Overseas Market Access Requirements for bovine semen to The United Republic of Tanzania, BOVSEM.TZ dated 20 December 2017;
- (ii) the revocation and replacement of the Overseas Market Access Requirements for bovine semen to The United Republic of Tanzania, BOVSEM.TZ, dated 21 July 2016;
- (iii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for bovine semen to The United Republic of Tanzania.

This notice takes effect from 20 December 2017.

2. The United Republic of Tanzania requirements

Bovine semen exported from New Zealand to The United Republic of Tanzania must be accompanied by an official assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

Explanatory note:

If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the bovine semen does not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the bovine semen does not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.

VETERINARY CERTIFICATE

I,, being an Official Veterinarian of the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries, certify, after due enquiry in regard to the animal(s) and semen listed in this Zoosanitary Certificate, that:

1. Country freedom

1.1 New Zealand is free from brucellosis (*Brucella abortus*).

2. Semen collection centre

2.1 The semen collection centre at which the semen was collected:

2.1.1 is approved by the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries; and

2.1.2 is under the direct supervision and sanitary control of a centre veterinarian who is approved by the New Zealand Ministry for Primary Industries.

3. Donor animals

3.1 The donor bull(s) had been continuously resident at the semen collection centre for at least one (1) month prior to collection of semen and had not been used for natural service / mating in that time.

3.2 At the time of collection, the donor bull(s) was clinically healthy and clinically free from diseases that are transmissible in semen including: listeriosis, bovine viral diarrhoea/mucosal disease (BVD/MD), infectious bovine rhinotracheitis (IBR), enzootic bovine leucosis (EBL), Johne's disease (*Mycobacterium paratuberculosis*) and pyogenic infections.

4. Testing of the donor bulls

4.1 Within the six (6) months prior to the collection of the semen, or post collection, the donor bull(s) has been tested, with negative results, for the following diseases: bovine tuberculosis, trichomonosis (*Trichomonas foetus*) and bovine genital campylobacteriosis (*Campylobacter foetus*).

NB: The Official Veterinarian must sign, date and stamp each page of the veterinary certificate using a different colour ink to the paper and the print, and, where applicable, sign, date and stamp each page of the documents (e.g. laboratory reports) that form part of the extended health certification.

EXPORT CERTIFICATION

(This is not part of the official certification)

NOTES: This export certificate replaces the previous certificate dated 12 July 2016, and is based on a Veterinary Import Permit from the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries of Tanzania, provided by the exporter.

1. An Import Permit is required.
2. Export consignments must be accompanied by the original import permit and a zoosanitary certificate.

Section 61A of the Animal Products Act 1999 states that 'The Crown is not liable, and nor is the Director-General or any employee of the Ministry liable, for any loss arising through the refusal or failure of the relevant authority of an overseas market to admit export animal material or animal product to that market'.
