## 1. Statutory authority

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

(i) the issue under section 60 of the export requirements for laboratory zebra fish (*Danio rerio*) and zebra fish embryos for research purposes to Germany AQUFISLAB.DE dated 8 November 2016;

(ii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for laboratory zebra fish (*Danio rerio*) and zebra fish embryos for research purposes to Germany.

This notice takes effect from the 8<sup>th</sup> of November 2016.

## 2. Germany requirements

Laboratory zebra fish (*Danio rerio*) and zebra fish embryos exported from New Zealand to Germany for research purposes, must be accompanied by an official assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

## **Explanatory note:**

If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the laboratory zebra fish (*Danio rerio*) and zebra fish embryos for research purposes do not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the laboratory zebra fish (*Danio rerio*) and zebra fish embryos for research purposes do not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.

#### **COUNTRY:** GERMANY

- **NOTES:** This certificate is based on an import permit issued by the Hessian Ministry of the Environment, Climate Protection, Agriculture and Consumer Protection (Germany) for this commodity on 6 May 2015, as provided by the exporter.
- 1. An Import Permit is required.
- 2. Consignments must be transported to Germany by air.
- 3. Each consignment must be accompanied by the original import permit, or a certified copy thereof, and an original zoosanitary/animal health certificate signed by an official veterinarian.
- 4. The zoosanitary/animal health certificate is valid for 10 days from the date of issue.
- 5. The fish/fish embryos must be transported directly from the port of import to the consignee, without adding or removing any material during transport.
- 6. The containers used to transport the fish/fish embryos must not allow the seepage of any liquid from containers.
- 7. The fish/fish embryos must be consigned to a closed or containment facility of the specified recipient.

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Section 61A of the Animal Products Act 1999 states that 'The Crown is not liable, and nor is the Director-General or any employee of the Ministry liable, for any loss arising through the refusal or failure of the relevant authority of an overseas market to admit export animal material; or animal product to that market'.
