

Maori Agribusiness: Pathway to Productivity Programme - Ngati Pahauwera Agribusiness Development Project

The challenge	Ngati Pahauwera is a confederation of approximately 80 hapu located between Napier and Wairoa. They have approximately 7,000 registered members.
	Rawhiti Station was returned to Ngati Pahauwera as part of the Treaty Settlement, the Trust has purchased four other farms in their traditional rohe, Pihanui Station, Omahara Farm, Chimney Creek and Kakariki Station.
	The challenge for Ngati Pahauwera Commercial Development Ltd is to seize the opportunity to build scale and focus on increasing productivity and profitability from their farms in an integrated way.
	The farms are in close proximity with each other and it is the Trust's intention to operate the farms as one business.
Purpose of the project:	To build capability, skills and knowledge across Ngati Pahauwera to deliver increased economic returns from their assets. This project is about managing these farms as one business
	unit.
Project outcomes:	 develop a farming strategy to inform what opportunities exist for efficient land use, and to increase productivity and profitability; and identify long term economic advancement opportunities including future markets and partners.
