#### **1. Statutory authority**

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

- (i) the issue under section 167 of the overseas market access requirements for dogs and cats to Cambodia, PETANI.KH dated 27 March 2018;
- (ii) the revocation and replacement of Dogs and cats to Cambodia 18.01.10;
- (iii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for dogs and cats to Cambodia.

This notice takes effect from 27 March 2018.

#### **2. Cambodia requirements**

Dogs and cats exported from New Zealand to Cambodia must be accompanied by an Official Assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

<p>Explanatory Note: If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the dogs and cats do not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the dogs and cats do not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.</p>

1.1 The dog(s) has been fully vaccinated according to manufactures instructions against rabies, infectious canine hepatitis virus, canine parvovirus, canine distemper, and leptospirosis at least fourteen (14) days and not more than one (1) year before the date of exportation to Cambodia.

**2** In the case of cats:

2.1 The cat(s) has been fully vaccinated according to manufactures instructions against rabies, panleucopenia, rhinotracheitis, calicivirus at least twenty one (21) days and not more than one (1) year before the date of exportation to Cambodia.

**3** In the case of dogs and cats:

3.1 The animal(s) was inspected and was found to be free from evidence of infectious or contagious diseases.

3.2 The animal(s) is fit to travel.

2. MPI are aware that in some instances an Import Permit is not issued, and instead a letter of permission is issued to the exporter, in these circumstances it is acceptable to put Not Applicable on the section detailing the permit number on the export certificate.
3. A valid vaccination certificate must accompany the animal(s).

**Section 61A Animal Products Act 1999 states that 'The Crown is not liable, and nor is the Director-General or any employee of the Ministry liable, for any loss arising through the refusal or failure of the relevant authority of an overseas market to admit export animal material or animal product to that market'.**
