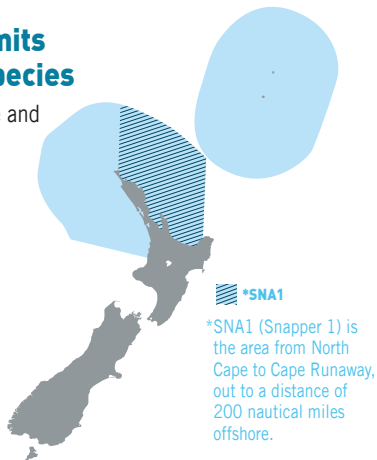

### How to measure your finfish

Measure from the tip of the nose to the end of the middle ray of “V” in the tail.

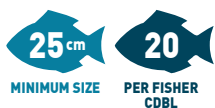


## Popular finfish sizes and limits

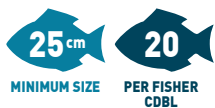
### Combined daily bag limit (CDBL) fish

These fish are part of the combined daily bag limit. This means you cannot exceed a **total** catch of 20 of any combination of the following species that are part of this bag limit.

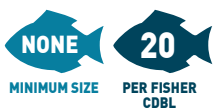

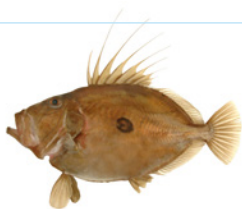

## Fines and penalties

Undersized fish	<b>\$250 fine</b>
1 x over the daily limit	<b>\$250 fine</b>
2 x over the daily limit	<b>\$500 fine</b>
More than 3 x over the daily limit	<b>Prosecution and/or gear forfeiture</b>

## Check the rules using our FREE services:

- **Download** our free NZ Fishing Rules app by texting the word 'app' to 9889 **OR** by scanning the QR code. The app works even when you have no coverage.
- **Free text** the name of the species you are fishing for (e.g. blue cod, snapper) to **9889** and receive legal size and bag limit via return text.
