

Collecting stock for transport

Any livestock selected for transport must be healthy and in good condition, free of injury, defects and disease, and not recently castrated or dehorned.

Farmers, or those who select livestock for transport, can be fined \$500 for each animal transported with:

- × eye cancer
- × lameness



- ✗ injured or diseased udders
- ingrown or injured horns or antlers, or
- \times in late pregnancy.

Livestock with these conditions can only be transported:



- to another farm, a short distance for treatment.
- You must comply with **all** the conditions on a veterinary certificate.



Horns A pointy issue

Transporting livestock with horns or antlers increases the risk of injury and should be avoided where possible.

Do not transport an animal with horns or antlers in a manner that causes injury to itself or others.



Electric prodder

Transport is stressful to livestock.

- \times Do not use unnecessary force.
- \times The use of electric prodders is restricted.

There are some limited circumstances, where electric prodders can be used on the muscled hind or forequarters of:

- cattle over 150 kg
- ~

pigs over 150 kg (when loading and unloading for transport).

Animals must have space to move away from the electric prodder.

Preventing injury during transport


Drive with care

Injuries during transport cause significant pain and distress to livestock.

Do not load, unload or transport an animal in a manner that causes injury, or back-rub.



Too tall? Make a call



"Back rub" is a serious injury caused when an animal rubs against the top of a stock crate, damaging the skin and muscle. It can happen when animals are too tall for the crate, on long journeys, or rough roads.

Animals over 1.4 metres at the hip need to be transported on the bottom deck or on a single-decked truck.

Ask the supplier if there are any tall stock, so you can plan the best journey and select the right truck.

Ask the supplier to draft tall stock into a separate mob before the truck arrives, so they can be loaded separately.
