Proposed process and timelines for strengthening fisheries management

2019

Public consultation (this paper)

Consider feedback Confirm approach Develop legislation Implement any agreed changes to landing & return to sea rules, offences & penalties, and other technical fixes

Public consultation on monitoring and verification approaches for commercial fisheries

2017-2019

Ongoing, phased rollout of electronic catch and position reporting

Amending the rules for commercial fishers regarding what fish must be brought back to port and what fish can be returned to the sea

Change sought:

Improved sustainability through good practice fishing and innovation

Tighten the rules for returning fish to the sea

Increase the flexibility around fish being returned to the sea

Options

Retain current rules



Landing and returns-to-sea summary

Our Options	Minimum Legal Size (MLS)	Other Releases
Current Rules (Option 3)	There are MLS for a range of fish, mostly found inshore	Some species of fish can be returned to the sea live, if they meet certain conditions, e.g. likely to survive
Option 1: Tighten the rules	Removal of MLS for finfish, but MLS retained for shellfish, eels and crustaceans	Only under very limited circumstances
Option 2: Increased flexibility	Potential for MLS to be set for a wider range of species, based on both biological and economic grounds	Greater flexibility in allowing fish to be returned to the sea



Ensuring effective and fair offences and penalties for landings and returns

Change sought:

Effective and fair approach that ensures the integrity of the fisheries system, and maintains a level playing field

Introduction of new criminal offences

Introduction of infringement offences

Our proposal

Changes to defences for illegal behaviour



Streamlining the decision-making process for setting catch limits

Change sought:

Improve our responsiveness to changes in our fish stocks while providing greater certainty to stakeholders

Our proposal

Enable our catch limits to be adjusted using Harvest Control Rules

Enabling other controls to be changed more quickly



Technical fisheries management changes

Attributing other sources of fishing mortality to the sector that caused it

Our proposals

Amend powers relating to the installation and maintenance of cameras

Ensuring continuity between the North and South Islands
