Cabinet Legislation Committee paper for five separate commodity levy orders from the vegetables and fruit sector

Purpose:

Attached for your signature is a submission to the Cabinet Legislation Committee, seeking authorisation to submit the following commodity levy orders to the Executive Council:

- a. Commodity Levies (Vegetables and Fruit) Order 2019;
- b. Commodity Levies (Process Vegetables) Order 2019;
- c. Commodity Levies (Fresh Vegetables) Order 2019;
- d. Commodity Levies (Fresh Tomatoes) Order 2019;
- e. Commodity Levies (Onions) Order 2019.

Key messages

- 1. On 7 November 2018, you agreed to proceed with the preparation of the following levy orders, based on the Ministry for Primary Industries' (MPI) assessment that these applications meet the requirements of the Commodity Levies Act 1990 [B18-0808 refers]:
 - a. Commodity Levies (Vegetables and Fruit) Order 2019;
 - b. Commodity Levies (Process Vegetables) Order 2019;
 - c. Commodity Levies (Fresh Vegetables) Order 2019;
 - d. Commodity Levies (Fresh Tomatoes) Order 2019; and
 - e. Commodity Levies (Onions) Order 2019.
- 2. The Commodity Levies (Vegetables and Fruit) Order 2013 currently imposes a mandatory levy on all vegetables and fruit commercially grown in New Zealand, as well as additional levies on process vegetables, fresh vegetables and tomatoes. The order will expire on 12 May 2019. The proposed levy orders, excluding onions, will serve to separate these additional levies into their own individual orders.
- 3. The Commodity Levies (Onions) Order 2013 currently imposes a mandatory levy on all onions commercially grown in New Zealand. The order will expire on 12 May 2019. The proposed levy order on onions will replace the current order.
- 4. Horticulture New Zealand (HortNZ) has requested that commodity levy orders on vegetables and fruit, process vegetables, fresh vegetables and fresh tomatoes commence on 1 April 2019, to align with HortNZ's financial year. Onions New Zealand has asked for the levy order on onions to commence on 13 May 2019.
- 5. In order to meet the proposed deadline of 1 April 2019, MPI recommends that you submit the attached paper to Cabinet Office by 13 February 2019, for consideration by the Cabinet Legislation Committee on 19 February 2019.
- 6. The Parliamentary Counsel Office (PCO) has drafted the proposed levy orders and has certified them as being ready for submission to Cabinet. PCO will submit the order directly to Cabinet Office.

Recommendations

- 7. The Ministry for Primary Industries recommends that you:
 - a) Note that Horticulture New Zealand Incorporated has applied for a new levy order on vegetables and fruit under the Commodity Levies Act 1990, to replace the Commodity Levies (Vegetables and Fruit) Order 2013 from 1 April 2019;

 Note that Onions New Zealand Incorporated has applied for a new levy order on onions under the Commodity Levies Act, to replace the Commodity Levies (Onions) Order 2013 from 13 May 2019;
