Disbudding and dehorning

Disbudding and dehorning are painful.

From 1 October 2019, new rules require local anaesthetic to be used when disbudding and dehorning cattle.

Disbudding

Do not disbud calves without using effective local anaesthetic.

Otherwise you could face a criminal conviction and fine of up to \$3,000 (or \$15,000 for the business)

Have a conversation with your veterinarian about training and the supply of local anaesthetic.

Talk to your disbudding contractor and make sure they're up to speed with the requirements.



Dehorning

Do not dehorn cattle without using effective local anaesthetic.

Otherwise you could face a criminal conviction and fine of up to \$5,000 (or \$25,000 for the business)

Avoid having to dehorn older animals by using polled breeds, or disbudding them as young calves. Consider horn management when purchasing cattle.
