## Draft for Consultation

## Introduction

This introduction is not part of the Import Health Standard (IHS), but is intended to indicate its general effect.

## Purpose

An **IHS** specifies the requirements for **importing risk goods** into New Zealand. This **IHS** specifies the requirements that must be met when **importing private consignments** of **fresh fruits and vegetables** into New Zealand.

## Background

An IHS issued under the New Zealand Biosecurity Act 1993 (the Act) specifies the requirements to be met to effectively manage biosecurity risks associated with importing risk goods, including the risks from incidentally imported new organisms. IHSs include measures that must be applied in the exporting country before the risk goods are exported. IHSs also include requirements that must be met by importers before biosecurity clearance can be given.

## Who should read this?

This **IHS** should be read by anyone importing **private consignments fresh fruits and vegetables** for human consumption.

## Why is this important?

It is the responsibility of the **importer** to ensure that **risk goods** (i.e. **fresh fruit and vegetables**) comply with the requirements of the relevant **IHS**. **Risk goods** that do not comply with the requirements of an **IHS** may not be **cleared** for **entry** into New Zealand and may be directed for **treatment**, re-shipment, destruction or further action deemed appropriate by a **Chief Technical Officer** (**CTO**).

Importers are liable for all associated expenses.

## Equivalence

A **CTO** may consider an application for an **equivalent phytosanitary measure** to be approved, different from that provided for in this **IHS**, to maintain at least the same level of protection assured by the current measure(s).

**Equivalence** will be considered with reference to the **International Standard for Phytosanitary Measures ISPM 24.** *Guidelines for the determination and recognition of equivalence of phytosanitary measures.*

## Part 1: Requirements

## 1.1 Application

(1) This **Import Health Standard (IHS)** applies to **private consignments** of **fresh fruits and vegetables** imported for human consumption.

### **1.2** Incorporation by reference

- (1) The following documents are incorporated by reference under section 142M of the Act:
  - a) ISPM 5. Glossary of phytosanitary terms. Rome, IPPC, FAO.
  - b) **ISPM 12.** *Phytosanitary certificates*. Rome, IPPC, FAO.
  - c) MPI Biosecurity Organisms Register for Imported Commodities (BORIC). Wellington, MPI.
  - d) MPI Schedule of Regulated (Quarantine) Weed Seeds. Wellington, MPI.

Under section 142O(3) of **the Act** it is declared that section 142O(1) does not apply, that is, a notice under section 142O(2) of **the Act** is not required to be published before material that amends or replaces any material incorporated by reference has legal effect as part of those documents.

## 1.3 Definitions

(1) Definitions are listed in Schedule 1.

## 1.4 General

- (1) Private consignments of fresh fruits and vegetables imported into New Zealand must:
  - a) meet the requirements of the relevant commodity IHS; and
  - b) if applicable, meet the specific requirements in Part 2 Specific Requirements for Fruit Fly Material.
- (2) A private consignment of fresh fruits and vegetables may receive a biosecurity clearance if the fresh fruits and vegetables meet the requirements of this IHS and the relevant commodity IHS.

#### Guidance

- All units in a **private consignment** of **fresh fruits and vegetables** and the associated **packaging** may be inspected upon arrival to ensure compliance with the requirements of this **IHS**.
- Individual **commodity IHSs** specify the **import** requirements for all **fresh fruits and vegetables** and can be found on the MPI website.

## Part 2: Fresh Fruit and Vegetables

## 2.1 Specific Requirement for Fruit Fly Host Material

- (1) All fruit fly host **commodities** must:
  - a) be shipped in **pest proof packaging**;
  - b) be sealed with a destructible sticker/label identifying the authority in the exporting country and directly traceable to the **phytosanitary certificate**.

#### Guidance

- MPI considers fruit fly host material to be of high risk of **contamination** from **economically important fruit fly** species.
- Some fresh commodities (commercially manufactured and processed fruits and vegetables of specific commercial brands that have undergone pre export assessment by the Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI)). These commodities are listed in <u>"Processed" Fresh Commodities</u> These commodities are not considered to be risk goods and do not need to comply with the requirements of this IHS. To apply to have a processed fresh commodity assessed to be listed, contact <u>Plantimports@mpi.govt.nz</u>.

## Schedule 1 – Definitions

Definitions have the same meaning as defined by **FAO**, **ISPM 5.** *Glossary of phytosanitary terms* or **the Act** unless set out below. Derived forms of terms set out in the aforementioned sources, e.g. *inspect* from *inspection*, are considered to have the same meaning as the defined term.

#### Economically important fruit flies

Those regulated fruit flies which, on entry into New Zealand, would cause a major disruption to market access for a wide range of New Zealand **commodities** and/or have significant economic impacts on their production and/or have significant economic impacts on the environment.

#### Private consignment

#### **Regulated pest**
