## 1. Statutory Authority

Pursuant to section 60 of the Animal Products Act 1999, I notify the following overseas market access requirements and specifications, entitled reptiles to Indonesia.

This notice takes effect from date of signing.

#### 2. Requirements of Indonesia

Reptiles exported from New Zealand to Indonesia must comply with the import requirements of Indonesia listed in this notice as follows:

- 2.1 An import permit is required to export reptiles to Indonesia.
- 2.2 An official veterinarian authorised by the New Zealand Ministry of Agriculture and Forestry must certify, after due enquiry, the following:
- 2.2.1 All reptiles on the property showed no clinical evidence of bacterial diseases caused by *Pseudomonas, Aeromonas, Proteus, Arizona, Klebsiella, Citrobacter* and *Salmonella* species, and infectious stomatitis (mouth rot, ulcerative gingivitis, ulcerative stomatitis) during the last 12 months prior to export.
- 2.2.2 The animals had no evidence of abscess, neoplasia and fungus disease (white spot disease) at the time of export.
- 2.2.3 The animals have been treated against endo- and ecto-parasites within 30 days of export.

2.2.4 At the time of loading for export, the animals were found to be in good health, and were free of any clinical evidence of diseases and ectoparasites.

### 3. Definitions

For the purposes of this document:

Any term or expression that is defined in the Animal Products Act 1999 and used, but not defined in this document, has the same meaning as in this Act.

## **Explanatory Note**

These Overseas Market Access Requirements are based on the 'Health Requirements for the Importation of Reptiles from New Zealand into Indonesia', which were received from the Directorate General of Livestock Services, Ministry of Agriculture, Jakarta, in January 2007

- 3. The vessel/aircraft used for carrying the reptiles shall be in a clean condition and the holding disinfected with an effective disinfectant.
- 4. The journey from the port of departure in New Zealand to the port of destination in Indonesia shall be by a direct route, with no intermediate stop at any port.
- 5. No other animals are allowed on board the vessel/aircraft while shipping the approved reptiles. Dispensation for this requirement may be permitted, but must be approved by the DGLS.
- 6. If an outbreak of infectious stomatitis or infection with *Pseudomonas*, *Aeromonas*, *Klebsiella*, *Proteus*, *Arizona or Citrobacter* species occurs during the journey, the vessel is not allowed to moor at any Indonesian port. In that case, the entire consignment will be rejected.
- 7. On arrival at the port of destination, the consignment must comply with the current animal quarantine regulations.

Section 61.A of the Animal Products Amendments Act 2005 states that 'The Crown is not liable, and nor is the Director-General or any employee of the Ministry liable, for any loss arising through the refusal or failure of the relevant authority of an overseas market to admit export animal material or animal product to that market.'
