Guidance Document

1 Purpose

- (1) This guidance document has been issued to accompany Dogs and Cats to Thailand (OMAR). This guidance document should be read in conjunction with that OMAR.

2 Specific guidance for the zoosanitary certificate

- (1) In regards to Clause 4.1 and 4.2, a single vaccine is acceptable. However it is recommended the owners complete the vaccine course as per the manufacturer's instructions for the animal's protection.

3 Additional information

Further information taken from the requirements for the importation of dogs and cats to Thailand suggests:

- (1) A transit can only occur at an approved intermediate port. The dogs and cats for import are not allowed to be exposed to any other animals if they have landed in transit at any approved intermediate port.
- (2) The dogs and cats, if transited, must not leave the airport except to proceed to an approved transit quarantine area.
- (3) The dogs and cats must be conveyed in nose and paw proof crates designed to avoid any risk of injury or unnecessary suffering.
- (4) After arrival in Thailand, the dogs and cats may be subjected to quarantine at an approved premises for at least 30 days, during which they may be submitted to tests and treatments deemed necessary. The owner will be fully charged for the incurred expenses.
