

# Cats and Dogs Category 3 Documentation

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## 1 Introduction

## 1.1 Purpose

To successfully apply for an import permit through our online application portal; <u>Animal and Plant Import Permit System (APIPS)</u>, the documentation provided must be complete, accurate and legible. Chrome is the recommended browser to use.

We recommend you **apply at least six weeks prior** to the day you need the permit for booking flights and organising travel. MPI need at least **20 working days** for processing a **complete and accurate permit** application. The 20 working days is calculated from application date and will be reset where documentation is missing or incorrect, or details entered online are not accurate. Incorrect documentation may result in having to change your entry date.

Note: if the documentation is not complete, or information is missing or incorrect, the application may be declined at the importers expense. The application will need to be resubmitted, and a further charge will be incurred. Double check that everything is in order and correct to avoid being charged twice and entry being delayed.

You should already be familiar with the import requirements and guidance by this point, but if you need further help, see below for links to all relevant documents to prepare your pet for import.

## 1.2 Importing cats and dogs into New Zealand

# 2 Applying for a permit

(1) Once you have checked the documentation is accurate and complete you can apply for a permit online. See <u>Cats and Dogs Online Import Permit Application</u> for instructions on how to apply for an online permit through APIPS. Ensure you have the following documentation, and your credit card with you prior to applying for the permit.

# 3 List of documentation required

- (1) The table below **lists** the documentation required for category 3 countries.
  - a) If you prefer a visual representation, see *Illustration of documentation required*, for sample copies of each document required, and what information it needs to contain.
- (2) You will need these documents to upload online. Ensure they are accurate, and are the correct documents asked for.

#### 3.1.1 Microchip implantation

- (1) While MPI no longer require a copy of the microchip implantation certificate for issuing the permit, have it on hand in case we need it to verify the information provided online.
- (2) You will need to present evidence of the microchip implantation date however to the registered vet, and the official vet, when they complete, review, sign and stamp the <u>Official Vet Declaration (OVD)</u> (see section 2.2 Official vet declaration (OVD) for further information on the OVD)

Document Type	Category 3 Countries
OVD	Completed and signed by a registered vet, and signed and stamped by the official vet. All relevant sections must be completed.  Check it has been fully completed before you upload.
Rabies titration laboratory (lab) form	The laboratory form states the results of the rabies titration test.  The sampling date (date the blood was drawn), and the results go on the OVD.
Rabies vaccinations	If this is the first rabies vaccination your pet has had (primary), it must have been given at least six months prior to export to New Zealand.  If your pet has had more than one rabies vaccination, the two most recent (as long as neither lapsed) go on the OVD. If there has been a lapse between the two most recent rabies vaccinations, the last will be considered a primary vaccination and will also mean a six month wait.

Document Type	Category 3 Countries
	The microchip number <b>must</b> be on the page the rabies vaccination details are stated. If this is not the case, have the vet verify the number and add it to the rabies vaccination page.
	The rabies vaccination details are stated on the OVD.
	Check that all rabies related fields on the OVD are completed.
Quarantine  This booking confirmation letter is provided to you by the MPI appropriately owned quarantine facility. It must have the entry and exit cand be signed by the facility operator to be valid.	
	Do not send us the contract you have with the facility; we only want the booking confirmation letter.


# 4 Illustration of documentation required

(1) The following section provides an illustrated version of the instructions.

## 4.1 Official vet declaration (OVD)


- (1) The <u>Official Vet Declaration</u> provides verification from your vet, and the government approved official vet, that your animal fulfils the rabies requirements for entry into Aotearoa, New Zealand. Ensure you are using the **most current version at the link above**. If it is out of date, you may be asked to have it done again.
- (2) You will need to present the following documentation when submitting the OVD for the vets to complete, check and authenticate:
  - a) Evidence of microchip implantation date
  - b) Titration test laboratory result form
  - c) Rabies vaccination records
- (3) The OVD must be:
  - a) Completed and signed by a registered vet.
  - b) Reviewed, signed and stamped by the official vet.
- (4) See below for an example of how the form must be completed. Ensure you read the guidance information in red or in a red box carefully, and check that all information is correctly completed by the vets before uploading in APIPS. You will need to take it back to the vets if information is missing or incorrect. This is likely to delay entry.

**Note:** the OVD is a dynamic form and is often updated. The following illustration may not be the current version found at the above link, but the information required will be the same.



## 4.2 Laboratory result form for the rabies titration test


- (1) Your vet will draw blood from your pet to have it tested for a rabies titration level. The result shows the level of protection against rabies. If it is below 0.5 IU/mL, then the animal will need to be revaccinated for rabies and have the test repeated. This test is valid from three months after the blood draw date.
- (2) Your vet will send the blood sample to a government approved laboratory. The lab is usually in the country of export, but some vets send the blood sample to an approved lab overseas.
  - a) Ensure that your vet understands that the sample is to be tested for **travel overseas**. Tests for domestic travel may be different to those used for international destinations. If it is the incorrect test, this will delay entry by three months (titration test is valid three months from the blood draw date).
- (3) The lab results must have the following information on it:
  - a) Microchip number: this identifies the animal being tested
  - b) **Date of sampling:** this is the date the blood was drawn from your animal, and is the date from which the entry date may be calculated from (not including rabies vaccination requirements)
  - c) Result: the level of antibodies in your animal's blood that show an acceptable level (>= 0.5IU/ml) of protection against rabies.



## 4.3 Rabies vaccination records


- (1) There are 3 rabies vaccination record samples below. They represent 3 of the 4 types of vaccination records we accept from around the world. Although there are many different styles, the information presented, and required, is the same regardless of country of origin, or style used.
- (2) If the animal has only been vaccinated for rabies once, this must have been at lease 6 months prior to import into New Zealand and no more than 12 months.
- (3) If the animal has had two or more rabies vaccinations, the two most recent should be recorded on the OVD, and stated in the online application. The most recent cannot be more than 12 months prior to import.
  - a) Note: if the previous rabies vaccination has lapsed, then the one after it becomes the primary and is valid when the six months requirement has been fulfilled (ie earliest entry is six months after this date).
- (4) Identify the example that matches the type of record you have for your pet and ensure that all the information we require is present.
- (5) If you do not have a record that resembles the examples below, the **4**<sup>th</sup> **option** is to get your vet to write a letter on vet letterhead detailing the rabies records of your pet. The letter must state the following (as with all other record types):
  - a) Microchip number of your animal
  - b) Rabies vaccination details:
    - i) Date the vaccination was administered
    - ii) Duration of immunity (1, 2 or 3 years)
    - iii) Batch number
    - iv) Expiry date of vaccination batch
  - c) Name and signature of your vet

## 4.3.1 Example 1 - Vaccination booklet for your pet




## 4.3.2 Example 2 - Rabies vaccination certificate

- (1) A rabies **certificate** is often a stand-alone document that has the rabies vaccination information on it and is signed by the vet at the time of issue.
- (2) The certificate should have the following information for import purposes:
  - a) Microchip number
  - b) Date of rabies vaccination
  - c) Duration of immunity (usually 1, 2 or 3 years in case of this example the duration of immunity is 3 years, from 2020 to 2023)
  - d) Signature of vet, and details of registration or qualifications
- (3) If the microchip is not present on the certificate, the vet must add the number and sign in full to authenticate. The certificate is only valid for import if the microchip was implanted prior to or at the time of the vaccination. You may be asked for evidence of implantation date.



#### 4.3.3 Example 3 - Pet passport – unique passport number on each page (like a human passport)

(1) The following is a pet passport. It is similar to a human one in that each page has a unique passport number on it. We use this to link the page with the microchip number to the rabies vaccination page.
These are the only two pages we need to verify the rabies vaccination information. The microchip number therefore does not need to be added to the rabies vaccination page and we do not require any other pages from the passport.



## 4.4 Quarantine booking confirmation letter

(1) Once you have contacted the quarantine facility in New Zealand that you have chosen for your animal, they will send you a booking confirmation letter similar to the one below. The letter confirms the dates the facility is keeping space free for your animal. It is signed by the operator of the facility.

## 4.4.1 Change of entry date

- (1) If your entry dates change you must contact the facility and ensure they have space available for the new dates.
- (2) If your current import permit is **not valid for the new dates**, you will need to apply for a new permit (at current cost for a permit). Email us at <a href="mailto:animal.imports@mpi.govt.nz">animal.imports@mpi.govt.nz</a> with the following information when requesting an updated entry date:
  - a) Copy of the current permit, or reference ID of the permit
  - b) Updated booking confirmation letter
- (3) As long as the rabies requirements are still valid (for category 3 countries only), a payment request will be sent to you by email from on-line system when the permit amendment is being processed. The email will contain a link. Click on the link to pay for the amendment. You will need your credit card handy.
