# BIRDOHEC.BD 5 DECEMBER 2014 – DAY-OLD CHICKS AND HATCHING EGGS TO THE PEOPLES REPUBLIC OF BANGLADESH

### 1. Statutory authority

Pursuant to section 60, section 60A, section 62(1) and section 167 of the Animal Products Act 1999 I notify the following:

- (i) the issue under section 60 of the export requirements for day-old chicks and hatching eggs to the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh BIRDOHEC.BD dated 5 December 2014;
- (ii) the determination under section 62(1) of the format and content of the official assurance for dayold chicks and hatching eggs to the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh;
- (iii) the revocation and replacement of the export requirements for day-old chicks to Bangladesh BIRDOCEC.BAN 19.04.04.

This notice takes effect from the 5<sup>th</sup> of December 2014.

# 2. Bangladesh requirements

Day-old chicks and hatching eggs exported from New Zealand to the Peoples Republic of Bangladesh must be accompanied by an official assurance in the form of a completed zoosanitary certificate.

The zoosanitary certificate as specified below must be completed and certified, after due enquiry, by an Official Veterinarian of the Ministry for Primary Industries.

#### Explanatory note:

If the zoosanitary certificate is not certified then the day-old chicks and hatching eggs do not satisfy the conditions in the notice. Likewise, if the day-old chicks and hatching eggs do not satisfy the zoosanitary requirements in the certificate, then the certificate will not be certified.

3.	The day-old chicks / hatching eggs originate from parent flocks that are negative for Salmonella Pullorum.

5.	[The day-old chicks were hatched in hatchers that were disinfected or fumigated prior to loading.] *

country freedom. It was approved by Bangladesh on 10 November 2014.

1. An import permit is not required, however, any importer interested in importing day-old chicks or hatching eggs into Bangladesh must contact the Ministry of Commerce to establish the proper process to follow. Where a no objection certificate (NOC) is issued by the Ministry of Commerce or the Sponsoring Ministry / Division (or by both) these documents must accompany the zoosanitary certificate (consignment).

- 2. The Ministry for Primary Industries approves a hatchery and its associated source flocks that supply either hatching eggs and / or day-old poultry as an export approved premises. The export approved premises approval number applies to the hatchery and associated source flocks and should be recorded in section II for eggs exported directly from the source farm.
- 3. Identification of day-old chicks / hatching eggs: the "Description / Identification" column should be used to enter any identification information or other information that would match the consignment to import documentation.
- 4. A day-old chick means a live poultry chick within the first seventy-two (72) hours of its life or while it has not been fed, whichever period is shorter.
- 5. The commodity type is indicated in the identification table.

Clauses that apply to a specific commodity only should not be deleted, unless specifically indicated.

Where a clause refers to more than one commodity type, it is taken to apply only to the commodity type indicated in the identification table.

Where a clause refers to a commodity type not indicated in the identification table and deletion is not indicated, it is taken to not apply.

- 6. Clause 4 applies to hatching eggs only and should be deleted entirely if not applicable.
- 7. Clauses 5, 6, and 7 apply to day-old chicks only and should be deleted entirely if not applicable.
