EXPORT CONDITIONS FOR RABBITS TO THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA* *except Hawaii

New Zealand is classed as a "rabies free" country by the United States Department of Agriculture and there are no restrictions on the importation of rabbits from this country providing that on arrival "the owner makes a declaration that they have been in New Zealand for 6 months" or since birth.

However, if the animals are **not** accompanied by their owner a statutory declaration attesting to the fact that they have been in New Zealand for 6 months or since birth should accompany the animals. The exporter should arrange for such a declaration to be made in front of a solicitor.

Notwithstanding the fact that no veterinary certificates are required for rabbits being exported to the United States*, most airlines will not accept animals for shipment to this country unless they are accompanied by a veterinary certificate of health stating that the animal is fit to travel. Such certificates must be written on headed veterinary practice note paper.

Veterinary surgeons signing any certificate must ensure that their name and qualifications are typed or printed beneath their signatures.

*Please note, an Animal Welfare Export Certificate (AWEC) is issued to all animals leaving New Zealand at the point of exit.
