1.2 Scope

The requirements listed in this Importing Country's Phytosanitary Requirement (ICPR) apply to product of New Zealand only, unless specifically stated.

This ICPR specifies American Samoa's phytosanitary requirements for the stated commodities and commodity classes only. If a commodity or commodity group is not identified within Section 3 or Section 4 exporters should contact:

American Samoa directly to ascertain requirements

or

Ministry for Primary Industries (MPI)-Plant Exports

2.1 Prohibitions

- All Seed, Grains and Nuts
