Porcine Enzyme: Packaging Material

CTO direction to biosecurity inspectors for the clearance of porcine enzymes that have been commercially packaged.

Pursuant to section 27(1)(d)(iii) of the Biosecurity Act 1993 I, Vicki Melville, Manager Animal Imports, Ministry for Primary Industries (under delegated authority), give the following directions for porcine enzymes to be given clearance in accordance with the following measures, different from those in the applicable import health standard *Specified Porcine Enzymes into New Zealand from Canada and the United States of America* [porenzic.nam].

Clause 8.2 states the product must be commercially packaged and hermetically sealed. The porcine enzymes will be commercially packaged and have tamperproof seals applied to the bags. The reason for directing clearance is that there is no biosecurity risk associated with the product not being hermetically sealed.

This direction takes effect from the date of signing and continues in effect until amended or revoked.
